Periodic monitoring of shallow groundwater in the use area is recommended.

INSECT RESISTANCE MANAGEMENT

For resistance management, **Denote** contains dinotefuran and is classified in the neonicotinoid chemical class as a Group 4A insecticide, neonicotinoid acetylcholine receptors (nAChRs) of the central nervous system of insects. Any insect population may contain individuals naturally resistant to **Denote** and other Group 4A insecticides. The resistant individuals may dominate the insect population if this group of insecticides are used repeatedly in the same fields. Appropriate resistance-management strategies should be followed.

To delay insecticide resistance, take the following steps:

- Rotate the use of **Denote** or other Group 4A insecticides within a growing season, or among growing seasons, with different groups that control the same pests.
- Use tank mixtures with insecticides from a different group that are equally effective on the target pest when such use is permitted. Do NOT rely on the same mixture repeatedly for the same pest population. Consider any known cross-resistance issues for the tarneted nests between the individual components of a mixture.
- In addition, consider the following recommendations provided by the Insecticide Resistance Action Committee (IRAC):
 - Individual insecticides selected for use in mixtures should be highly effective and be applied
 at the rates at which they are individually registered for use against the target species.
 - Mixtures with components having the same IRAC mode of action classification are not recommended for insect resistance management.
 - When using mixtures, consider any known cross-resistance issues between the individual components for the targeted pest(s).

APPLICATION INFORMATION

Applications of **Denote** in residential areas may be made by commercially licensed applicators.

Application to Turfgrass:

Use **Denote** for the control of soil inhabiting pests of turfgrass such as Masked Chafers, European Chafer, Green June Beetle, May or June Beetle, Japanese Beetle, Oriental Beetle, Billbugs, Annual Bluegrass Weevil, Black Turfgrass Ataenius, Ants (excluding fire, pharaoh, harvester, Argentine, or carpenter ants), and Mole Crickets. **Denote** is also suitable for surface feeding insects such as: armyworms, of cutworms and chinchbugs in turfgrass areas.

Apply Denote as directed on outdoor residential, recreational and commercial turfgrass in sites such as home lawns, commercial lawns, multi-family residential and apartment complexes, grounds or lawns around business and office complexes, shopping centers, airports, military and other institutions, cemeteries, qolf courses, playgrounds, parks, athletic fields and sod farms.

Target timing of **Denote** applications at or just prior to or during egg laying of the target pests. The need for an application can be based on historical and/or physical monitoring of the site, current season adult trapping, previous experience or other methods. Optimum control will be achieved when applications are made at first appearance or just prior to or at egg hatch of the target pests followed by sufficient irrigation or rainfall to move the active ingredient through the burt flatch layer. Consult your State Extension Service for information reparding specific application timing. DO NOT apply when the target site is saturated with water. Adequate distribution of the active ingredient cannot be achieved when these conditions exist.

APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

For best performance, always follow these directions:

- Apply Denote when insect pest populations begin to build, but before populations reach economically damaging levels. Check with your State and County Extension Service for availability of economic thresholds for pests controlled by Denote.
- Denote is a selective insecticide which will typically have minimal impact on beneficial arthropods
 and fits use is compatible with Integrated Pest Management (IPM) programs. However, Denote
 is toxic to bees exposed to direct treatment or to residue on blooming crops and weeds. DO NOT
 apply Denote or allow it to drift onto blooming plants if bees are forcating in the treated area.
- Denote is taken up into foliage after application. However, thorough spray coverage is essential for optimal performance. Apply Denote in sufficient water to ensure good coverage.
- Denote will suppress some pests. Suppression is defined as either inconsistent control (good to poor), or consistent control at a level below that generally considered acceptable for commercial control.

Mixing Instructions

Add 1/2 of the required amount of water to the mix tank. With the agitator running, add the desired amount of **Denote** to the tank. Confinue agitation while adding the remainder of the water. Begin application of the solution after **Denote** has completely dispersed into the mix water. Maintain anitation until all of the mixture has been anollied.

Volumes, weights, and conversions:

APPLICATION PROCEDURES AND SPRAY FOUIPMENT

Ground Application

Select spray nozzles that will provide accurate and uniform spray deposition. Use spray nozzles which provide medium sized droplets and reduce drift. To help insure accuracy, calibrate sprayer before each use. For information on spray equipment and calibration, consult nozzle manufacturers and/or State and County Extension Service.

Apply **Denote** using sufficient water volume to provide thorough and uniform coverage. In situations where a dense canopy exists and/or pest pressure is high, use greater water volumes. Spray adjuvants will improve spray coverage on some plant surfaces. **DO NOT** apply under conditions that will prevent adequate spray coverage or that will promote excessive spray drift.

Applications to Turfgrass:

Apply **Denote** through conventional spray equipment in a minimum of 1 gallon of finished spray per 1000 sq. ft. Ensure adequate distribution in the treated area using accurately calibrated equipment normally used for application of turfgrass insecticides. Use equipment that will produce a uniform, coarse droplet spray, using a low pressure setting to eliminate off target drift. Check calibration periodically to ensure that equipment is working properly. Prevent skips by using marker dves or foam aids.

Precautions and Restrictions:

- DO NOT graze treated areas or use clippings from treated areas for feed or forage.
- Prevent runoff or puddling of irrigation water following application.
- Keep children and pets off treated areas until spray has dried.
- DO NOT apply to areas that are waterlogged or saturated or frozen, which will not allow penetration into the root zone of the plant.

TANK MIXING INFORMATION

NOTICE: Tank mixing or use of this product with any other product which is not specifically and expressly authorized by the label shall be the exclusive risk of user, applicator and/or application advisor. Read and follow the entire label of each product to be used in the tank mix with this product. Add 1/2 of the required amount of water to the mix tank. Start the agitator before adding any tank mix partners. Whenever possible add tank mix partners in this order: products packaged in water soluble packaging, wettable powders, wettable granules (dry flowables), liquid flowables, liquids, emulsifiable concentrates, surfactants and adjuvants. Always allow each tank mix partner to become fully dispersed before adding the next product. Provide sufficient agitation while adding the remainder of the water. Maintain agitation until all the mixture has been applied.

When using **Denote** in tank mixtures, add all products in water soluble packaging to the tank before any other tank mix partner, including **Denote**. Allow the water soluble packaging to completely dissolve and the product(s) to completely disperse before adding any other tank mix partner to the tank.

If using **Denote** in a tank mixture, observe all directions for use, crops/sites, use rates, dilution ratios, precautions and limitations which appear on the tank mix product label. **DO NOT** exceed labeled dosage rate of any product in the tank mix. Follow the most restrictive label precautions and limitations of any product in the tank mix. **DO NOT** mix **Denote** with any product whose label prohibits such mixing. Tank mixtures or other applications of products referenced on this label are permitted only in those states in which the referenced products are labeled.

Compatibility

IMPORTANT: The crop safety of all potential tank mixes on all crops has not been tested. Before applying any tank mixture not specifically recommended on this label, confirm safety to the target crop.

Denote is compatible with most commonly used pesticides. However, since it is not possible to test all possible mixtures, the user must pretest to assure the physical compatibility and lack of phytotoxic effect of any proposed mixtures with Denote. To determine the physical compatibility of Denote with other products, use a lar test, as described below:

Using a quart jar, add the proportionate amounts of the products to 1 qt. of water. Add wettable powders and water dispersible granular products first, then liquid flowables and emulsifiable concentrates last. After thoroughly mixing, let stand for at least 5 minutes. If the combination remains mixed or can be remixed readily, it is physically compatible. Once compatibility has been proven, use the same procedure for additional required ingredients to the soray tank.

SPRAY DRIFT ADVISORIES

DO NOT apply under conditions involving possible drift to food, forage or other plantings that might be damaged or the crop thereof rendered for sale, use or consumption.

THE APPLICATOR IS RESPONSIBLE FOR AVOIDING OFF-SITE SPRAY DRIFT. BE AWARE OF NEARBY NON-TARGET SITES AND ENVIRONMENTAL CONDITIONS. Applicator is responsible for employing practices that will minimize spray drift at the application site.

IMPORTANCE OF DROPLET SIZE

An effective way to reduce spray drift is to apply large droplets. Use the largest droplets that provide target pest control. While applying larger droplets will reduce spray drift, the potential for drift will be greater if applications are made improperly or under unfavorable environmental conditions.

Controlling Droplet Size - Ground Boom

Volume - Increasing the spray volume so that larger droplets are produced will reduce spray drift. Use the highest practical spray volume for the application. If a greater spray volume is needed, consider using a nozzle with a higher flow rate.

Pressure - Use the lowest spray pressure recommended for the nozzle to produce the target spray volume and droplet size.

Spray Nozzle - Use a spray nozzle that is designed for the intended application. Consider using nozzles designed to reduce drift.

Controlling Droplet Size - Aircraft

Adjust Nozzles - Follow nozzle manufacturers' recommendations for setting up nozzles. Generally, to reduce fine droplets, nozzles should be oriented parallel with the airflow in flight.

BOOM HEIGHT - Ground Boom

For ground equipment, the boom should remain level with the crop and have minimal bounce.

RELEASE HEIGHT - Aircraft

Higher release heights increase the potential for spray drift.

SHIFI DED SPRAYERS

Shielding the boom or individual nozzles can reduce spray drift. Consider using shielded sprayers. Verify that the shields are not interfering with the uniform deposition of the spray on the target area.

TEMPERATURE AND HUMIDITY

When making applications in hot and dry conditions, use larger droplets to reduce effects of evaporation.

TEMPERATURE INVERSIONS

Drift potential is high during a temperature inversion. Temperature inversions are characterized by increasing temperature with altitude and are common on nights with limited cloud
cover and light to no wind. The presence of an inversion can be indicated by ground fog or by
the movement of smoke from a ground source or an aircraft smoke generator. Smoke that
layers and moves laterally in a concentrated cloud (under low wind conditions) indicates an
inversion, while smoke that moves upward and rapidly dissipates indicates good vertical air
mixing. Avoid applications during temperature inversions.

WIND

Drift potential generally increases with wind speed. AVOID APPLICATIONS DURING GUSTY WIND CONDITIONS. Applicators need to be familiar with local wind patterns and terrain that could affect spray drift.

MANDATORY SPRAY DRIFT MANAGEMENT

Aerial Applications

- DO NOT release spray at a height greater than 10 ft. above the ground or vegetative canopy, unless a greater application height is necessary for pilot safety.
- . Applicators are required to use a medium or coarser (ASABE S572.1) droplet size.
- D0 NOT apply when wind speeds exceed 15 mph at the application site. If the windspeed is greater than 10 mph, the boom length must be 65% or less of the wingspan for fixed wing aircraft and 75% or less of the rotor diameter for helicopters. Otherwise, the boom length must be 75% or less of the wingspan for fixed-wing aircraft and 90% or less of the rotor diameter for helicopters.
- For aerial applicators, if the windspeed is 10 miles per hour or less, applicators must use 1/2 swath displacement upwind at the downwind edge of the field. When the windspeed is between 11 - 15 miles per hour, applicators must use ¾ swath displacement unwind at the downwind edge of the field.
- . DO NOT apply during temperature inversions.

Ground Boom Applications

- User must only apply with the release height recommended by the manufacturer, but no more than 4 feet above the ground or crop canopy.
- . Applicators are required to use a medium or coarser droplet size (ASABE S572.1).
- . DO NOT apply when wind speeds exceed 15 miles per hour at the application site.
- DO NOT apply during temperature inversions.

Boomless Ground Applications

- Applicators are required to use a medium or coarser droplet size (ASABE S572.1) for all applications.
- . DO NOT apply when wind speeds exceed 15 miles per hour at the application site.

Precautions and Restrictions

- DO NOT apply more than a total of 2.7 lb. per acre (1.0 oz. per 1000 sq. ft.) (0.54 lb. a.i. per acre) of Denote per acre of turf per year.
- Apply in sufficient water to ensure thorough coverage of target area. Use a minimum of 50 gallons finished spray per acre.
- Consult your local State Extension Service or State Extension Turfgrass Specialists for more specific information on timing of insecticide applications.
- For optimal absorption, translaminar movement, and control, avoid applications immediately before rainfall or irrigation. For best results, DO NOT irrigate or water for 24 hours after application. If rainfall does not occur in 48 hours after application, irrigate with sufficient water to ensure movement of the active ingredient through the thatch and into the root zone.
- · Make only one application per calendar year.
